he system of higher education as the world knows it can trace its roots back several centuries to medieval Europe. In fact, nine of the world's 10 oldest universities that are still in operation are located in Western Europe.

"In China, science and technology are developing quite rapidly, so there is a lot of room for even scientific cooperation with them. We would like to welcome Chinese students to Finland and share with them an alternative way of studying so they gain a more global perspective," said Education Finland Program Director Jouni Kangasniemi.

"Finland's higher education is also known for partnerships that provide real-life work experience, so that students are not doing only theoretical studies but also learning by applying the knowledge they gained in the classroom," Kangasniemi added.

# FINLAND At the top of the world

To celebrate its centennial in 2017, Finland reminded its 5.5 million citizens how successful the country was in improving their standards of living and quality of life. For four consecutive years, the Nordic nation topped World Happiness Report, a survey conducted by the U.N.'s Sustainable Development Solutions Network.

In other lists and surveys, Finland ranks among the top 3, including the safest, freest, best governed, least corrupt, most prosperous, most gender equal, cleanest and greenest, most literate and numerate, and best educated. It is no wonder the country continues to attract more visitors, tourists and international students alike, every year.

For international students, the relaxed, laid-back way of life is one of the most attractive aspects of Finland. Of course, none of them overlooked the quality of education offered by the country's universities and schools. In the QS World University ranking for 2021, nine Finnish universities figured among the Top 500.

Now regarded to have the best education system in the world, Finland instituted unorthodox and progressive policies 50 years ago. Early childhood education and care (ECEC) lies at the heart of the whole education system.

Apart from knowledge and skills, ECEC incorporates health and wellbeing as components of holistic development.

Finland's education system also did away with standardized testing, required rigorous standards for all teachers (all must have a Master's degree), fostered cooperation instead of competition, provided professional options beyond the traditional college degree, and allowed modern study environments and non-traditional instruction.

Perhaps, the encouragement to cut loose from convention is what gave the world out-of-the-box solutions: the world's first Internet browser, the wireless heart monitor, Linux open source software and mobile texting or SMS.

## Education Finland: Building a unique brand



Because of a growing reputation for excellence and distinctive approach to education, Finland's universities and schools have attracted attention around the world. Although international travel remains restricted, the government looks forward to the day it can welcome international students back to its classrooms.

Early this year, GMI Post interviewed **Jouni Kangasniemi**, **the Program Director of Education Finland**, to learn how the government is promoting the Finnish brand of education around the world, particularly in China, despite the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

GMI Post: Can you tell us about Education Finland's successful partnerships around the world?

Kangasniemi: There are some universities in Finland and China

that have formed partnerships and have agreed to expand their cooperation, for example, in how they can establish double degree programs. Some Chinese universities also want to modify their structure and make it more similar to our polytechnic or applied sciences universities.

In the Caribbean, Tampere University of Applied Sciences came up with a program tailored for the region.

## GMI Post: Are you seeing more Finnish universities and institutions reaching out to China?

**Kangasniemi:** Yes. We have seen many Chinese students expressing their wishes to study in Finland. China is among the top three sources of international students. There are a lot of ongoing activities between Finland and China.

Because we are quite well known for teacher education programs, we have seen increased cooperation between Beijing University and the University of Helsinki.

### GMI Post: Looking to the future, where would you like to see more collaboration between China and Finland?

**Kangasniemi:** Chinese develops rapidly in terms of technology and science, so there's a lot of room for scientific cooperation. We would also like to introduce Chinese students to our alternative way of studying and help them gain a global perspective.

## The growing value of Chinese student

How Europe's universities are planning a future with China





We've had quite a number of partnerships with top universities in China for some time now. We have seen those partnerships go smoothly. In terms of exchange programs, they fit well into each other's system. At the moment, we are discussing with a number of potential Chinese partners plans to set up in Beijing something similar to the Food Valley here.

Chinese partners are vital. The most important thing is knowledge development. We do not invest in or take shares from any of our activities in China. We collaborate to generate new knowledge. We have no plans to build satellite campuses. We have an office in Beijing to support collaborations with universities, research institutions and businesses that we may want to collaborate with.

We have a strategic partnership with Beijing University and of course have a lot of other partnerships in China. I am aiming for student mobility. That's really what I want to enhance, as well as virtual mobility, once the pandemic is over. Those are two things that am looking forward to for Chinese students and our local students too.

China still ranks as the 2nd largest group of international students in France. In 2005, we saw the first collaboration between a French engineering school and a Chinese partner, the result of which was the Franco-Chinese Institute (IFC). There are now about ten IFC between French engineering schools and Chinese higher education institutions.

Last year, before the pandemic, we had a meeting with the Chinese Embassy in France, during which they stated their desire to continue developing the IFC program, focusing specifically on French engineering schools. This is how we remain attractive to Chinese industry. We do not just attract Chinese students to study in France but, importantly, we also allow them to study in a French institution in China. That's important.











China has become and remains one of our core priorities. The Chinese are now the 2nd largest student community after the French. That was a result of more than 20 years of collaborative efforts to develop prestigious partnerships in China and improve our multidisciplinary science and engineering programs.

As a global institution, we aim to attract students from around the world. We consistently maintain all our relationships across the globe, especially our long-standing ones with China. While we strive to attract more Chinese students to come study in France, we also strongly encourage French students to study in the stimulating higher education environment in China.

China is becoming a very important market for us. We are trying to enhance our relationship with China and our partner universities. We are exploring double degree programs and also executive education with our partner schools, not just have student exchange programs.

For now, we currently admit Chinese students; but we are definitely looking to increase our presence in China. We have a representative office in Shanghai, which advises students who want to study in EM Normandie and strengthen our relationships with Chinese universities.

## Engineering the future of education

Apart from the appeal of its interesting history, stunning architecture and rich culture, France remains a preferred destination among international students seeking higher education abroad because of the reputation of its universities, the most recognizable of which has to be Sorbonne University in Paris.

The birthplace of The Age of Enlightenment and the Declaration of the Rights of Man and the Citizen, France is very proud of its role in advancing the study of humanities.

In a completely different sphere, the country also gained global admiration for its engineering prowess. It co-built the Concorde, the first supersonic commercial plane, as well as the Train Grand Vitesse or TGV, which broke the long-time speed record held by Japan's "bullet trains" when it was launched in 1981. And perhaps unknown to many, French inventors also gave us "smart cards" and the camera phone.

France's reputation for excellent education can be attributed to its 250 or so grandes écoles, which generally specialize in a single field, like engineering, business or public administration. Because admission into these schools is limited to a few hundred people, they are considered prestigious institutions.

Apart from the grandes écoles, France also has numerous state-funded public universities and colleges that have gained much recognition around the world. These schools include so-called Communities of Universities and Institutions (COMUE), which are grouping of universities and institutes of higher learning that can confer degrees to their graduates.

Over the past few years, among the most popular fields of study is engineering and the fastest-growing group of international students is Chinese.

"Based on our latest data, we have more than 32,000 international students in our engineering schools. As of this year, China ranks second in the number of international students based on country of origin," said Jocelyne Brendlé, the President of the International and Development Commission for the Conference of Deans of French Schools of Engineering (CDEFI).

While Brendle pointed out a 25% decline in international student enrollment since the

COVID-19 pandemic last year, Hendrik Lohse, Director of International Affairs of EM Normandie Business School, has seen a rise in interest from Chinese students and predicts a sharp rise once the vaccination program gains momentum in France.

"With the vaccination strategy already rolled out in France, we have seen an upswing in the number of applications for the coming year, with a significant number coming from Chinese students," Lohse said.

"China is becoming a very important market for us in the future. We are definitely trying to enhance our relationship with China and our partner universities, exploring possibilities in executive education and in granting double degrees," he added.

## Tiny country, big footprint

For a small country, the Netherlands has played a deeply influential role in world affairs. Once, the Dutch kingdom dominated global trade. Its Golden Age bequeathed priceless works of art that are centerpieces of the world's best museums. Today, many inventions developed there have made our daily lives much more efficient and convenient. Think the DVD, Bluetooth and Wi-fi.

None of those achievements would have happened were it not for an openness to embrace new ideas and venture beyond prevailing limits. That spirit of innovation and creative thinking still exists in the country's universities, many of them centuries old but all of them pioneering.

In fact, in The Times Higher Education Ranking for 2021, seven Dutch universities made it to the top 100. Another huge advantage for international students is, thankfully, the Dutch are one of the most proficient English speakers.

Because the Netherlands has remained a very popular destination for international students, graduates get to

build an extensive network of colleagues from around the world and gain valuable exposure to different cultures. Tuition fees are also very affordable.

For Chinese students, getting an education in the Netherlands provides them with a competitive advantage in the job market upon returning home.

But for those students looking to gain some work experience in the Netherlands, they will obtain a valuable view of how world-class companies operate and get to use the skills and knowledge gained during their studies. Another advantage of the Dutch education system is the close partnerships build between universities and industry.

# Still at the center of the world



Once the center of global trade, the Netherlands was at the crossroads cultures spanning the globe – from its neighbors in Europe to its former colonies in Southeast Asia. That globalized outlook and openness to other cultures is deeply ingrained among the Dutch.

Certainly, it is those same traits that have kept the Netherlands an important trading hub, a major industrial power and an innovative learning center.

In March, GMI Post interviewed **Dutch Minister of Education Ingrid van Engelshoven** to ask her about the enduring appeal of obtaining higher education in the Netherland for hundreds of international students and researchers.

GMI Post: How important are Chinese students, in particular, to the Netherlands?

van Engelshoven: Chinese students are the third largest group of international students in the Netherlands, after the Germans and Italians. Between 2019 and 2020, the Chinese made up around 5% of the number of international students in the Netherlands.

GMI Post: What are the competitive advantages of Dutch universities for international students?

van Engelshoven: Dutch universities, both our research universities and universities of applied sciences, offer very accessible, high quality education.

GMI Post: What distinguishes the Netherlands from other European countries when it comes to its international educational experience for Chinese students?

van Engelshoven: Dutch higher education institutions have more international courses and English-taught courses than other European countries. Aside from that, many of our research universities top global rankings consistently.

GMI Post: What measures are the government taking to encourage more international students to come to the Netherlands?

van Engelshoven: Our policy to attract international students has been very successful. At the moment, we are not instituting new measures to attract more international students. To make education here more attractive, we are working harmonizing the needs of the labor market with the programs most popular with our international students.
